HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME

Over the past week we have noticed a marked increase with families taking children out of school for a holiday. Some instances have been totally unavoidable (flight time change) and we accept this. We do not want to come across as showing a lack of understanding, particularly, after the tricky period we have been through, but holidays in term time, unless for an exceptional circumstance will not be authorised. You will also need to request any potential time off. When we return after the half term break, we will be implementing a 'Holiday Request' form which will be available from the office. This will need to be completed and handed back to school. Many thanks for your support and understanding in this matter.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - 'SQUID GAME'

We have been hearing from a number of children that they have been watching a programme called 'Squid Game' on Netflix which is currently one of the most popular shows on Netflix and has a rating of age 15 and above. The programme centres round a series of children's games that have deadly consequences, and is very violent in nature. We understand that there is other adult content and despite its initial appearance it is not suitable for younger children. The BBFC have awarded Squid Game a 15 rating in the UK for "sexual violence references, injury detail, crude humour, sex, suicide, sexual images, violence. This is very different from the 12a rating which allows younger viewers if they are supported by a parent or other guardian. The 15 rating states that the material is, "suitable only for 15 years and over with no concession for accompanying adults.". Some of you may not have realised the age certification of the programme so I wanted to draw your attention to this. You can also apply parental controls to Netflix (if you so wish) by setting up a Netflix children's profile which limits viewing to TV shows and movies which have been carefully selected for children. To do this: 1. Go to Netflix.com/account. 2. Scroll to 'Profile & Parental Controls 'and click on the profile you want to manage. 3. Click 'Change' next to the Viewing Restrictions setting. 4. Enter your Netflix password. 5. Set the maturity rating for the programmes and films you want to allow in that profile
