NEU (NATIONAL EDUCATION UNION) INDUSTRIAL ACTION

As reported in the news, the National Education Union (NEU), which is the largest Union in England for teaching staff, has balloted for industrial action and has met the government's threshold for turnout and the required percentage of votes in favour of strike action. The first date for action is Wednesday 1st February followed by the 28th February with further action planned for March. At present we are working on plans and any implications for our school. As soon as we are in a position to report any strike implications for St Mary's we will do so. We are working hard to listen to colleagues and understand the guidance from all unions.
