RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND THE CATHOLIC LIFE OF THE SCHOOL



On Monday we had a representative from CAFOD (Catholic Agency for Overseas Development) who shared with the children the work of CAFOD and how thousands of schools across England and Wales are getting involved with CAFOD's Lent challenge, joining 'The Big Lent Walk' to support families around the world with the skills and tools they have asked for to fight the climate crisis. We too will be joining in with this initiative during Lent and more details will follow in the coming

weeks. The children also heard the inspiring story of sixty eco-villages in southern Bangladesh that have learned and shared new skills in living and growing food sustainably, not only protecting themselves from the impacts of climate change and producing more reliable crops to eat and to sell, but also protecting the environment. Through an analogy of the moon reflecting the light of the sun children considered how they can use their gifts to do good and reflect God's light in the world. Many children were awarded for letting their light shine in our end of half term celebration assembly. Well done everyone for shining and living out our SANCTA values.
