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# **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND THE CATHOLIC LIFE OF THE SCHOOL**



In our whole school collective worship this week, the children have been learning about and reflecting on Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si' (Praise be to you) which is the appeal from Pope Francis addressed to 'every person living on this planet' for an inclusive dialogue about how we are shaping the future of our planet – 'our common home'. Pope Francis calls the Church and the world to acknowledge the urgency of our environmental challenges and to join him in

embarking on a new path. This encyclical is written with both hope and resolve, looking to our common future with candour and humility. The children have linked these themes with our whole school writing week focusing on the book Dear Greenpeace. Over this week and next, the children have been participating in activities that explore the themes of Laudato Si' and Dear Greenpeace to ignite their spark for writing, culminating in a letter to Pope Francis sharing their ideas of how we can care for the earth and respond to God's and Pope Francis' call to be stewards of creation. The children have been learning about their responsibilities as stewards of God's creation in RE as well as focusing on social justice and the Common Good. Please ask your children about their ideas; we have seen some very powerful and persuasive writing across the school and this theme has certainly struck a chord with all classes. We will be sending Pope Francis a selection of letters from each class. We hope that the Pope enjoys reading them as much as we have and is impressed by the children's knowledge and passion for action to make our world a better place to live in for future generations.

#### YEAR 1 PHONICS SCREENING CHECK

Over the course of this week, children in Year 1 have taken the national Phonics screening test, reading real and pseudo 'alien' words aloud using their phonics knowledge. This check was taken at the children's own pace with Mrs Bramhall. The check helps assess children's knowledge of phonics and reading levels and informs us at school for any additional help they might need as they move into Year 2.

The children have been preparing for the check in



school and we thank you parents at for working with your child at home, supporting them with their reading and sound knowledge using the resources supplied. This check is nothing to be



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concerned about <u>and this leaflet gives further information</u>. Well done to the Year 1 children, they have been amazing and have taken the screening check in their stride. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate asking Mrs Bramhall or Miss Poole, our lead teacher for reading. Parents/carers will receive their child's screening check results as part of the end of year report in July.

# YEAR 4 MULTIPLICATION TABLES CHECK (MTC)



This week has also seen children in Year 4, along with all Year 4 children in England, take the online Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). The MTC determines if Year 4 children can fluently recall their multiplication tables up to 12x12. The checks are deigned to help schools identify which children require more support to learn their times tables. There is no 'pass' rate or threshold which means that, unlike the Phonics Screening Check, children will not be expected to re-sit the check. The Department for Education (DfE) will create a report about the overall results

across all schools in England, not individual schools. Again, the children were fantastic and I am very proud of their positive attitude and approach to the check.
