led us in a fantastic collective worship on Monday afternoon. The children considered how during times of war and emergency, there have always been people trying to help and protect others. Remembrance is a time when we give thanks for the people who help and protect others now, and who have done so in the past. We listened to the poem 'In Flanders Fields' by John McCrae and the children shared some of their own war poems that they have written during History lessons. The mission for the children was to show their remembrance, for example by attending a service or observing the silence. Year 6's

messages helped us to prepare for our poignant and reflective whole school Remembrance Service this morning. The children respectfully reflected on those servicewoman and men who have paid the ultimate sacrifice for the freedoms we enjoy today. Special thanks to Mrs Groarke-Booth who playing a moving Last Post and Reveille (The Rouse) and to Mrs Tadikonda for representing the armed services. This bugle call rouses the living back to duty, after having paid respects to the memory of those who gave their lives for peace. At this time, let us continue to give thanks for their service and we pray that Jesus' message of peace be realised throughout the world, especially in Israel, Palestine, Russia and Ukraine.
