Meet the team:

Each term we will spotlight members of our SEND team. This term's team members are Mrs. Norburn and Mrs. Bradbury.



My name is Anita Norburn. I am the Special Educational Needs Disabilities Co-Ordinator (SENDCo) at St Mary's CVA. It is my role to oversee the provision made for children with additional needs and ensure staff are supported in all aspects of their work with children with SEND. I have a number of years' experience working with children with additional needs. I am a qualified dyslexia teacher and assessor and I have worked in the role of intervention support teacher across three Stockport primary schools for the past six years.


I am looking forward to working closely with both the parents/carers and children, creating targeted and inclusive SEND provision which ensures that all pupils reach their full potential. At different times in their school life children may need some additional support and if you have any concerns, at anytime, please do not hesitate to contact the class teacher or myself.



As Mental Health and Wellbeing lead across St Mary's I have an overview of social emotional and mental health provision and needs. Here at St Mary's, we hold this area of development in high esteem. All children can access support when needed at any time through their journey with us. This also extends to our wonderful parents/ carers too. For the children we have daily check ins, wellbeing hub drop ins, gardening, Nurture and ELSA groups, all of which provide support and guidance around SEMH (social, emotional and mental health). Levels of SEND Support at St Mary's.

I would like to take this opportunity to share our approach to supporting pupils with SEND with you. As with all schools, we work in line with the SEND Code of Practice and our Local Offer (please find links to these at the bottom for further information).



We are proud of the fact that staff at St Mary's know all children, particularly those with SEND, incredibly well. Levels of support for children with SEND will vary depending on the individual needs of each child and will form part of our graduated response. For the majority of children in school, including some with SEND, quality first teaching strategies are sufficient for them to make good progress against the age-related expectations of the national curriculum. However, some children will need additional support in place in order for them to thrive.

We can map out what additional strategies a child needs in the classroom on a pupil passport (for example a sloped writing board, ear defenders or a wobble cushion). If, despite Quality First Teaching and additional strategies, we are concerned about a child's progress, we will implement a Learning Plan. This is a working document that is co-produced by the child, their parents/carers and the class teacher, and has termly targets for the child to work towards. Progress against these individual targets is reviewed at Parents evening in November and March and in the summer term at a meeting which will also include your child's next class teacher.

The highest level of support available is an Educational Health Care Plan (EHC Plan) An EHC plan can only be issued after a child or young person has gone through the process of an Education, Health and Care needs assessment. An EHCP is for children and young people who have complex Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND). It is available from birth to the age of 25.
