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RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND THE CATHOLIC LIFE OF THE SCHOOL



The Gospel in our whole school Collective Worship reminds children and adults how those who follow Jesus are united as family in their faith. Through Jesus' words about God's family, made up of those who follow God's will, the children reflected on how they can be loving brothers and sisters to everyone and be inspired by the example of the saints who also loved God and followed His will. In this week's Gospel, it sounds like Jesus is being rude and disowning His family, but in fact, He was simply saying that God comes before everything! The children reflected about their first thoughts when

they get up in the morning and how they can reveal their priorities at that moment e.g. food, spending time with friends or family, playing games etc. Then, through watching a video about the daily routine of some Franciscan Sisters, the children also considered how they too can say 'yes' to God's will – making us part of His family of followers. The Gospel this week follows on from us reflecting on Mary's 'yes' during the month of May and how we can follow her example, through our SANCTA Values, to say yes to God and live life to the full.

PHONICS SCREENING CHECK

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Over the course of this week, children in Year 1 and some children in Year 2 have taken the national Phonics screening test, reading real and pseudo 'alien' words aloud using their phonics knowledge. This check was taken at the children's own pace with Mrs Bramhall (Y1) or Miss Poole (Y2). The check helps assess children's knowledge of phonics and reading levels and informs us at school for any additional help they might need as they move into Year 2 or Year 3.

The children have been preparing for the check in school and we thank you parents at for working with your child at home, supporting them with their reading and sound knowledge using the resources supplied. This check is nothing to be concerned about <u>and this leaflet gives further information</u>. Well done to the children, they have been amazing and have taken the screening check in their stride. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate asking Mrs Bramhall or Miss Poole, our lead teacher for reading. Parents/carers will receive their child's screening check results as part of the end of year report in July.

YEAR 4 MULTIPLICATION TABLES CHECK (MTC)

This week has also seen children in Year 4, along with all Year 4 children in England, take the online Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). The MTC determines if Year 4 children can fluently recall their multiplication tables up to 12x12. The checks are deigned to help schools identify which children require more support to learn their times tables. There is no 'pass' rate or threshold which means that, unlike the Phonics Screening Check, children will not be expected to re-sit the check. The Department for Education (DfE) will create a report about the overall results across all schools in England, not individual schools. Again, the children were fantastic, and I am very proud of their positive attitude

and approach to the check. Further details about the <u>MTC can be found here</u>. You can support your children with their times tables by using the Times Tables Rockstars programme that each St Mary's child has access to via their class Teams page.

THE GENERAL ELECTION – A CATHOLIC PERSPECTIVE

The Catholic Bishops' Conference have created a webpage about the issues important to Catholics in the forthcoming General Election on Thursday 4 July. Cardinal Vincent Nichols, President of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, has recorded a message encouraging Catholics, particularly young adults, to be "willing to get involved and vote" as the opportunity to vote in a general election is a "privilege". Cardinal Nichols is



asking voters to be active rather than passive in order to engage with politicians to ascertain their views on the key issues. "You want to know what your candidate will think and say on your behalf when that candidate gets into Parliament" says the Cardinal. He continues, "I would like to put forward a theme for us all to think about. How do we seek to construct a society in which families can flourish? That's the bedrock – many positive things flow from that." <u>Reflections on key themes are available here</u>.

50% CAP ON ADMISSIONS TO FAITH SCHOOLS CONSULTATION

The Government has opened a consultation on lifting the cap that for the last 14 years has limited the number of Catholic children that can be admitted into any new Catholic school.
