ATTENDANCE POLICY CHANGES 2024-2025



September marks a change in the procedures and systems, related to attendance at school, as a result of the new Government guidance called Working Together to Improve Attendance. This guidance is not just for schools and local authorities. It is statutory guidance and contains expectations for all parties, including parents/carers, as you can read here. At St Mary's, we work incredibly hard to engage families so that children attend school regularly. Our new Trust attendance policy and strategy,

which are <u>available on our website</u>, is focused on supporting first and enforcing later. However, where children are taken out or school for unauthorised absence (e.g. term time holidays) then we do have to refer for a fixed penalty notice to Stockport Local Authority. We hope you will work with us this year to avoid this. If you are requesting to take your child out of school during term time, please <u>complete the revised leave of absence request form</u> at least 15 school days before the requested date.

NURTURE GROUPS, ELSA (EMOTIONAL LITERACY SUPPORT) AND MSU (MOTOR SKILLS UNITED – GROSS AND FINE MOTOR SKILLS SUPPORT)

We are very fortunate to be able to offer these intervention groups for individuals/small groups led by a very talented team of trained teaching assistants from within our school team. Children may access these resources as a short block of support at any time throughout their journey through \$t Mary's. If your child is attending any of these sessions, this will have been discussed during our drop-in sessions after school
