## **EARLY YEARS PHONICS EVENING**



On **Wednesday 2 October** from 5:30-6:30pm there will be a phonics information evening for parents/carers of children in our Nursery and Reception classes. At St Mary's we use a Department for Education validated phonics scheme called 'Twinkl Phonics'. At the meeting Miss Poole (our phonics Leader), Mrs Bradbury (EYFS Leader) and Mrs Frost (Reception Teacher) we will share with you what phonics is, how it helps your child with

their early reading and writing and provide a range of ideas for activities and resources you can use to support your child at home. There will be an information meeting for Year 1 parents later in the year (please see the Key Dates letter).

# THE SAINT MARY'S WAY



At St Mary's, we have the highest expectations of behaviour for our children. We don't take it for granted that children automatically know how to behave and get along with others so we actively and explicitly teach our children this through our behaviour curriculum: The St Mary's Way. This curriculum outlines key behaviours and routines which help us ensure that the children at St Mary's are ready to learn, are respectful to all and are safe. As parents/carers are a child's first educators, it would be fantastic if you could take a look through this document in order to support our work at home, e.g. by promoting children say please/thank you, showing manners etc. Just like other areas of the curriculum, we know that children won't just behave in the way that we expect because we teach it in the same way

that they don't understand maths following input in a single lesson. We constantly reinforce expectations through our behaviour systems, assemblies and interactions around our school. Information about our approach to promoting positive behaviour is available on our website. Remember, you can monitor your child's behaviour by keeping an eye on their daily Dojo points.
