## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND THE CATHOLIC LIFE OF THE SCHOOL

Wear it Proud', encouraging children and staff to celebrate the importance of mental health awareness through vibrant self-expression. The day was filled with splashes of yellow, lively conversations, and activities designed to promote well-being, self-care, and compassion. By wearing something yellow, the entire school family stood united in breaking down the stigma surrounding mental health, fostering a supportive environment where everyone feels empowered to share their feelings. ### LIVING STREETS - TRAVEL TRACKER

St Mary's has again been selected to take part in the Living Streets Travel Tracker for another year. The walk to school challenge for Reception – Year 6 pupils is delivered by Living Streets, the UK charity for everyday walking, to help as many children as possible experience the benefits of walking to school. If children travel actively (walk/wheel, cycle, scoot or Park and Stride) at least once a week for a month, they get rewarded with a badge linked to this year's theme of 'walk with imagination'. Please remind your children as they are coming into school what method of travel they have used to ensure the correct pupils are



receiving badges. Park and Stride is parking at least 10 minutes away from school, preferably in one of the local car parks such as Brabyns, Etherow, the Memorial Park or the Midland. Last year's badges can be kept at home somewhere safe, ready to make room for our new badges.
