Can you complete the Rosary Challenge?



Pray a decade of the Rosary each weekday in October. Begin by carefully listening to a scripture passage. Then, pray the **Our Father**, the **Hail Mary** ten times and finish with the **Glory Be**. As you pray remember the words from scripture and pay attention to how God speaks and moves your heart.

Thank you to Dan, our Chaplain, who led us in a prayerful and reflective celebration of the word (collective worship) this week focusing on October – the month of the holy Rosary. Last week we met virtually with Bishop Patrick to recite a decade of the rosary with all the other schools in the diocese. He set us the mission to pray one decade of the rosary each weekday during October. Why not try this over the half term break. You can track your progress using this [chart](#). You could also use [this video](#) to help support your children. The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is

centred on the major events of the Incarnation and Redemption with each decade referring to an event in the life of Jesus and Mary. The Mysteries of the Rosary give us 'thumbnails' of the life of Christ and his Mother. The Joyful Mysteries are taken mostly from Saint Luke's Gospel in the New Testament. They involve the joyful events of Jesus' childhood. The Luminous Mysteries bring a deeper understanding of the public life of Jesus. They fill in the blanks between the childhood of Jesus and His suffering and death on the cross. The Sorrowful Mysteries remind us of how much Jesus loves us. They recall how He suffered and died just for us. The Glorious Mysteries tell us what happened after Jesus died - His Resurrection, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the love Jesus had for his Mother, Mary. This month the children have had the opportunity to focus on these mysteries in our optional Monday lunchtime Rosary Club.
