


YEAR 3 AND YEAR HARRYTOWN NETBALL FESTIVAL



we have achieved a very good **96.6%** attendance. When rounded we have hit our target for two months running - fantastic! Nationally, attendance currently

stands at 94.1%, so again, well done St Mary's for our strong attendance and thank you parents/carers for supporting strong attendance habits.
