CRUCIAL CREW

Year 6 had a fantastic afternoon at Crucial Crew and learned some valuable information about keeping safe. With Stockport Homes, we discussed what anti-social behaviour is, identified some examples and talked about possible consequences. The school nurses helped us to understand some of the dangers of vaping, whilst GMP explored ways that we can be safe when playing out or walking alone. TFGM showed us the differences between Anti-Social Behaviour and crime, and how both of these can have a big impact our public transport network. Finally, with MyBNK we developed an understanding of scam text messages: how to spot them and what to do if we receive one. It was an informative visit and all the children have taken away some 'crucial' life skills to help them on the next stage of their journey.

Our Y5 Sports Ambassadors have been doing a brilliant job of supporting classes in using the travel tracker and distributing the monthly badges. This week, they have undertaken a new responsibility out on the playground with KS2 at lunchtime.
