RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND THE CATHOLIC LIFE OF THE SCHOOL



This week our 'Faith Friends' from each year group led a wonderful celebration of the word reminding us that we are in the season of Advent – a time of reflection and preparation. We are preparing not only to receive Jesus on Christmas morning but also to remember that the Church gives us this season to remind us to slow down in the busyness of shopping, wrapping presents,

Christmas parties etc. to remember that we should also prepare ourselves to receive Jesus in the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation, but also to prepare our hearts for Jesus returning. One frustrating issue is that the available features and how you set devices up differ, so to help parents Internet Matters have good, non-techie guides which you can follow as part of their ABC Checklist. ABC stands for:

- A Activate parental controls.
- B Balance screen time.
- C Check and chat.
