

NEW DEVICES

INTERVENTIONS

At St Mary's, we run a range of intervention groups to support our children's social and emotional development as well as supporting children with special educational needs or disabilities (SEN/D). Just like external services, our intervention groups have a capacity. Therefore, we similarly operate waiting lists and we triage needs when adding children to different groups. Our



intervention groups, including services like ELSA, are not intended to be permanent provision for any child. They deliver time-limited therapeutic services to support our children. Please be assured that our staff are trained extensively to meet the needs of children in class. This means that a lot of needs can be met within universal provision that is ordinarily available across the school. CHILD DEVELOPMENT



Child development includes much more than the knowledge or skills we teach children at school. There are so many things, which we often take for granted, that are so valuable in helping children grow, develop and become independent. We know there are so many aspects of child development that we are limited in supporting at school due to the number of children in each class. Therefore, please do all you can to support children with the following at home: - Using cutlery appropriately

at mealtimes - Tying shoelaces and zipping coats - Getting dressed/undressed.

PACKED LUNCHES



We encourage all our children to eat a healthy meal at lunchtime. If your child brings a packed lunch, please make sure it is healthy and nutritious, for example, ham/cheese/egg/tuna sandwiches, fruit, yoghurt and water to drink - no fizzy drinks or flavoured juices. Thank you for helping your child to have a healthy lunchtime. If you would like your child to have a hot school dinner, especially during the cold winter months, please speak with Mrs Towell or Mrs Major in the School Office for further details.

If you are applying for a school (Reception) place for next September, applications should be made by next Wednesday, **15 January 2025** via the <u>Stockport Admissions website</u>. Please note: if your child attends St Mary's Nursery, this does not guarantee your child a place in the school. You will need to complete the application form using the link above by the closing date.



PARKING AND ROAD SAFETY REMINDER



We have received feedback from some residents regarding concerns about inconsiderate and potentially dangerous parking and driving around St Mary's during school drop-off and pick-up times. Specific issues highlighted include parking on double yellow lines, speeding along Hogarth Road and Constable Drive, mounting pavements, and obstructing pathways, making it challenging for pedestrians, particularly those with pushchairs or mobility needs.

As a school, we continue to promote safe and considerate parking practices. Recent initiatives include encouraging 'park-and-stride' options, engaging local councillors and enforcement officers, and having pupils campaign for safer streets. However, it is clear that further action is needed. We ask all parents and carers to take extra care when parking and driving near the school and not to park on Lowry Drive to ensure the safety of all children and members of the community. Let us work together to create a safe and respectful environment for everyone.

START OF TERM REMINDERS

Uniform - Our children are looking lovely in their winter uniform. Please remember to check the uniform section of our website, so that your child is attending school, wearing the correct uniform. You can order branded school uniform items from Bulldog Fashions, Glossop. School uniform includes black shoes. Please ensure that your child has shoes for school and trainers just for PE.

PE Kit - If you have not done so already, by Monday, please ensure that you have sent your child's PE kit into school, so they are well prepared for PE lessons, which started again this week. Each child needs a white PE shirt, dark shorts and pumps or trainers. As several lessons are outdoor, please also add



leggings/joggers and a sweatshirt, if you wish, to help keep them warm, especially with the threat of very cold weather on its way to us.

Hair - Any child with long hair MUST have it tied up/tied back rather than loose. Please ensure that your child has a bobble or clip in to keep their hair out of their face and workbooks.

Jewellery – A reminder that for health and safety reasons, no jewellery including earrings of any description are permitted in school. Flat analogue or digital (not smart) watches are permitted.

NHS PHARMACY FIRST SERVICE



The NHS Pharmacy First Service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment where appropriate, for seven common conditions without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment. Accessing the service may mean that pharmacists can help children feel better and back to school as quickly as possible, as well as

supporting parents/carers to also get better if they are unwell with one of the conditions covered under the service. There is no need to make an appointment; parents or carers can pop into their local Boots pharmacy with their child and ask for help under the service. Support for the following conditions can be accessed under the service, free of charge (unless NHS prescription charges apply):

Common condition	Patient eligibility
Earache	1 to 17 years
Impetigo	1 year and over
Infected insect bites and stings	1 year and over
Sore throats	5 years and over
Sinusitis	12 years and over
Uncomplicated urinary tract	Women 16 to 64 years
Shingles	18 years and over
