
R. We came 2nd overall and now progress to the Grand Final on 27 February at Bramhall High School.





SPOTLIGHT ON LEARNING - WHY DO WE FORGET?

One of the most common frustrations shared by parents and teachers is when a child forgets something they seemed to know perfectly well just the day before. It often leaves us thinking, 'but you knew yesterday!' While this can be exasperating, research on memory shows that forgetting is in fact a natural part of the learning process. When we learn something for the first time, it doesn't immediately settle or stick into long-term memory. Instead,



it requires repeated exposure and practice before it becomes securely embedded. This process of forgetting and relearning may seem counterintuitive, but each attempt to recall information strengthens memory and deepens true understanding.

The German psychologist Hermann Ebbinghaus illustrated this through his famous forgetting curve', which shows how quickly information fades after learning but also highlights how relearning helps it stick more effectively over time.

In school, children often engage in 'retrieval practice' - a teaching strategy where they are tested on knowledge learned in previous lessons, terms, or even years. Not only does this give teachers valuable insight into each child's progress, but the act of recalling information itself helps strengthen their memory. So, what can parents do? Here are two key takeaways:

- 1. Be patient: Forgetting is a natural part of learning. Try not to get too frustrated.
- 2. Revisit learning: Help your child by regularly checking if they remember things like spellings, times tables, and phonics sounds, even weeks or months after they first learned them.

By understanding and embracing this process, we can better support our children on their learning journeys.
