## RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND THE CATHOLIC LIFE OF THE SCHOOL



On Monday our SANCTA Squad led our celebration of the word focusing on Sunday's Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, when Jesus was taken to the Temple as a baby to be presented to God - a religious tradition and duty for all Jews. The Gospel story of this event is told through Simeon and Anna reflecting on the amazing day when they saw Jesus and through eyes of faith, recognised Him as the promised Saviour. The SANCTA Squad helped the children come to understand that they too can see Jesus with eyes of faith as the Light of the World - the light that leads us to joy, peace and truth. With your child, you might like to...

- Light a candle in a darkened room or turn on a lamp or torch and ask your child to describe how light changes the look and feel of their surroundings. Talk about the title for Jesus - the 'Light of the World' and explain that Jesus guides us with His loving light.
- Talk about ways they can shine Jesus' loving light in the world through their words and actions.

#### NSPCC NUMBER DAY 2025 - FRIDAY 7 FEBRUARY



## **CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK 2025**

This week, we have embraced the theme *Know Yourself*, *Grow Yourself* as part of Children's Mental Health Week. In class, children have engaged in meaningful activities, and we encourage families to continue the conversation at home using the linked resources: Resources and activities for Children's Mental Health Week





learning. Our approach begins in Nursery, where children check in daily by placing their name card in either a blue (sad) or green (happy) welly, creating a safe space for sharing feelings. Children who check in blue are gently supported, ensuring that even the smallest concerns are acknowledged and addressed. This practice continues throughout the school, with older pupils gradually introduced to a wider range of emotions for daily check-ins. To further support well-being, we offer lunchtime wellbeing groups for children who may need ongoing support or one-off follow-ups. In addition, children know they can approach dedicated staff members, including lunchtime supervisors, class teachers, and teaching assistants, for support at any time. book appointments. We look forward to welcoming you and sharing your child's learning journey.


# **HOUSE POINTS**
