We were deeply saddened to learn of the death of Pope Francis on Easter Monday, a much-loved and inspirational leader whose words and actions touched the hearts of millions around the world. He leaves behind a remarkable legacy of compassion, humility, and a tireless commitment to justice, peace, and care for our common home. Pope Francis had a unique gift for reaching out to people of all backgrounds, reminding us of the importance of mercy, forgiveness, and love



in action. Throughout this week, we have taken time as a school family to reflect on his life and example. In our class liturgies, the children have learned about his dedication to the poor, the marginalised, and to building a more just and compassionate world. On Tuesday morning, we joined with Bishop Patrick and schools from across the Diocese in a special virtual assembly, where we prayed together for the happy repose of Pope Francis' soul. We continue to hold him in our prayers, giving thanks for his extraordinary witness of faith and service.

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SPOTLIGHT ON WRITING



At St Mary's, we are incredibly proud of our talented young writers. Over recent years, we have worked hard to embed a consistent and engaging writing process that supports children in developing their skills and confidence. Our writing cycle typically spans two to three weeks and begins with an exciting hook, introducing a clear purpose and audience. Pupils are then immersed in high-quality texts before being taught specific writing skills, which they have the opportunity to practise and apply in their own work.

Teachers carefully plan a wide range of writing genres to ensure learning is creative, purposeful, and fun. For example, children might write a witness statement from one of the Three Little Pigs, a TripAdvisor review of Bury, a persuasive holiday brochure, or even a monologue from an object's point of view—such as *The Day the Crayons Quit*. Teachers also model high-quality writing so that pupils can clearly see what great writing looks like and 'magpie' ideas to use in their own work.

Children are given regular opportunities to share and publish their writing. This might include reading to younger pupils, sharing work with Mr Nish, exchanging writing with another school, or even emailing a piece to a well-known author. Our aim is to ensure that every pupil leaves St Mary's with a strong foundation in English and the skills, creativity, and confidence to express themselves as thoughtful, articulate members of society.
