

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND THE CATHOLIC LIFE OF THE SCHOOL



On Monday, Year 5 beautifully supported our whole school in exploring this week's Gospel theme of work. By reflecting on St Joseph, Jesus' earthly father, as a model of humility and service, they helped us to see how work can teach responsibility and discipline, and bring both satisfaction and fulfilment. Through their thoughtful drama, prayer, and song, Year 5 led us to understand that work is a gift from God: a way of sharing in His creative activity. They reminded us to respect the dignity of

workers, to value those who work in service of others across the world, and to use our own talents to make a positive difference. Our mission this week was to make an effort to do your work to the best of your ability and to help others with their work too. There have already been many examples of our school family living this out, from children taking extra care with their classwork, to pupils offering help to friends who were struggling. As one Year 5 child said, "When we help others with their work, we are showing them kindness and making God proud."

At St Mary's, one of our SANCTA values is *support*, and we believe it is important to show gratitude and care for those in our local community. This Harvest, we are once again inviting families to bring in donations for The Wellspring, Stockport, so that together we can share what we have with people who are homeless or facing hardship in our town. This year, The Wellspring's Harvest Festival theme is "Growing Futures Beyond Homelessness", reminding us that by giving generously we can help to plant seeds of hope,

opportunity, and dignity for others. This message also links closely with our Catholic Social Teaching focus for this half term: care of creation and the call to build a better future for all.

EARLY YEARS PHONICS EVENING



On **Wednesday 1 October**, **5:30–6:30pm**, we will be holding a Phonics Information Evening for parents and carers of children in our Nursery and Reception classes. At St Mary's, we follow <u>Twinkl Phonics</u>, a Department for Education validated scheme. During the session, Mrs Bradbury (EYFS Leader) and Mrs Frost (Reception Teacher) will explain what phonics is, how it supports children with their early reading and writing, and share practical ideas and resources to help you support your child at home. DOODLE BACK TO SCHOOL CHALLENGE 2025



Our children are taking part in the Doodle Back to School Challenge, designed to help them settle back into routines while building confidence in maths and English. By spending just 10 minutes a day on **DoodleMaths** and **DoodleEnglish**, pupils can fill gaps in knowledge, develop healthy learning habits, and even earn a special virtual badge! There are also exciting prizes on offer: our school will be entered into a national competition, with

the chance to win a bundle of games worth £75. Research shows that short, regular use of Doodle makes a big difference: 10 minutes a day adds up to five extra hours of learning each month. We encourage families to support children in taking part and to celebrate their achievements along the way. The Back-to-School Challenge commences today and runs until 2 October.

EUROPEAN DAY OF LANGUAGES 2025

Today at St Mary's we celebrated the **European Day of Languages**, with this year's theme "Languages Open Hearts and Minds" linking beautifully to the International Day for Peace. Throughout the week, children created decorated "messages in a bottle" filled with positive peace messages written in different languages, with help from teachers and families. We were proud to celebrate the many languages spoken by our children and their families, recognising that linguistic diversity is a gift which strengthens community and deepens intercultural understanding. This celebration



reflected our commitment to Catholic Social Teaching, especially the call to recognise the Dignity of every person. Pupils also brought in books, prayers, songs, and special items in languages meaningful to them, helping us to learn from one another. The day beautifully embodied our SANCTA values, showing Support as we stood together as one global family, Nurture in encouraging one another's gifts and heritage, Challenge through messages that inspire us to build peace, Trust in sharing openly with each other, and Aspiration as we looked beyond ourselves to create a more united and understanding world. One pupil summed it up by saying: "I loved learning peace words in different languages because it shows that no matter where we come from, we can all share the same message of kindness."

TRANSITION ALTHLETICS



Eight of our fantastic Year 6 children represented St Mary's at the Stockport SHAPES athletics transition event at Woodbank Park on Wednesday. The morning was designed to help bridge the move from primary to secondary school, with support from secondary Year 7 students across Stockport schools who encouraged and guided the younger pupils throughout the activities. Teams were made up of children from a range of

local primary schools, giving our pupils not only the chance to develop their teamwork and sporting skills but also a taster of the new friendships that await them when they move into Year 7 next year. Our children showed great determination, enthusiasm and sportsmanship, and we are very proud of how they represented St Mary's.

COFFEE AND CAKE SOCIAL

Our first Coffee and Cake social on 8th October 1.30-3.00pm is fast approaching. THE SAINT MARY'S WAY



At St Mary's, we have the highest expectations of behaviour for our children. We don't take it for granted that children automatically know how to behave and get along with others so we actively and explicitly teach our children this through our behaviour curriculum: The St Mary's Way. This curriculum outlines key behaviours and routines which help us ensure that the children at St Mary's are ready to learn, are respectful to all and are safe. As parents/carers are a child's first educators, it would be fantastic if you could take a look through this document in order to support our work at home, e.g. by promoting children say please/thank you, showing manners etc. Just like other areas of the curriculum,

we know that children won't just behave in the way that we expect because we teach it in the same way that they don't understand maths following input in a single lesson. We constantly reinforce expectations through our behaviour systems, assemblies and interactions around our school. Information about our approach to promoting positive behaviour is available on our website. Remember, you can monitor your child's behaviour by keeping an eye on their daily Dojo points.

NURSERY: for children born between 1 Sept 2022 - 31 August 2023: closing date **31 March 2026**.


RECEPTION: for children born between 1 Sept 2021 - 31 August 2022: closing date 15 January 2026.
