SACRAMENTAL PROGRAMME 2025/2026 - EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

I am delighted to share that preparations for the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Holy Communion are now underway for families resident in the parishes of Holy Spirit, Marple and St Mary's, Marple Bridge. The programme is open to any baptised Catholic child in Years 3–6 who has not yet made their First Holy Communion. Dan, our lay

- First Holy Communion will be celebrated at Holy Spirit on Saturday 9 May at 11:00am and at St Mary's on Sunday 17 May at 11:30am.

SCHOOL STREETS CONSULTATION



The School Street consultation drop-in held on Wednesday afternoon was very well attended, with many parents and local residents coming along to find out more about Stockport Council's proposal to introduce a School Street outside St Mary's on Lowry Drive. The initiative aims to make the road safer, reduce congestion, and encourage families to walk, cycle or scoot to school. Feedback from those who attended was very positive, with many welcoming the
