RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND THE CATHOLIC LIFE OF THE SCHOOL



This week, our SANCTA Squad led a thoughtful and prayerful whole school worship focused on our Religious Education topic for this half term, Creation and Covenant. This unit helps the children understand how God reveals Himself through creation and how He has formed a special relationship, known as a covenant, with His people throughout history. During worship, each year group shared their learning journey. Our younger children in Reception and Key Stage 1 have been discovering the beauty of God's creation and learning that every person is made in His image and loved by Him. In Lower Key Stage 2, the children have been exploring the stories of Abraham and Noah, learning about trust, promise and

faithfulness in God's covenant. Upper Key Stage 2 have been deepening their understanding of how God's covenants with His people prepared the way for Jesus, who brings a new and everlasting covenant of love. The SANCTA Squad led the whole school in prayer and reflection, helping us to see that God's love is constant and that we are all called to live in harmony with Him, with one another, and with creation.

October is the month of the Holy Rosary and Bishop Patrick has once again set us a mission of praying one decade of the Rosary (one Our Father, ten Hail Mary's and one Glory Be) each weekday during October. BE BRIGHT, BE SEEN ON THE ROADS



Please share this important reminder from Stockport Council's Road Safety Team with your children: As the evenings draw in and daylight hours shorten, it's especially important to stay alert and safe when walking or cycling. Encourage your child to wear something bright or reflective—or attach a reflective tag to their school bag—so that they can be easily seen by drivers. If they cycle, make sure their lights are working and switched on. When crossing roads, look for the safest places such as zebra or puffin crossings, and always choose well-lit areas so that both pedestrians and drivers can see clearly. A few simple precautions can make a big difference in keeping everyone safe this autumn.




INDIVIDUAL AND SIBLING PHOTOGRAPHS

We are delighted to share that we have **met our school attendance** target of 97% for this half term, achieving an impressive 97.49% overall. This means we have reached our target for two consecutive months a fantastic achievement! Nationally, attendance currently stands at 95.1%, so we are
