RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND THE CATHOLIC LIFE OF THE SCHOOL



This week's theme was Youth, and our SANCTA Squad led a thoughtful and inspiring celebration of the word. They reminded us that young people play a vital and irreplaceable role in the life of the Church and in the world. Young people bring hope, inspiration and courage, helping us all to see new possibilities and to live the Gospel with joy. The children reflected on how the Church not only welcomes their voices, but needs their voices - their energy, ideas, enthusiasm and leadership. We were reminded that we are all called, whatever our age, to remain young in our outlook and attitude, embracing God's

gifts with openness so that we may continue to "live life to the full."

We were delighted to welcome Pete Dawson, one of our parents, who works for Tearfund, a charity committed to supporting youth leadership, ending poverty and promoting fairness globally. Together, we explored the Gospel story of the Feeding of the Five Thousand, reflecting on how we can share our own resources fairly and become voices of hope for others. It was a powerful reminder that acts of generosity—especially from young people—can transform communities and bring God's love to life. MEDICAL NEEDS & MEDICATION



If your child requires medication during the school day, please remember that we can only administer medicine that has been prescribed by a doctor or non-medical presciber such as a pharmacist. This means we are unable to give over-the-counter medications, such as Calpol, unless they are accompanied by a prescription. Children should also not bring throat sweets, ointments or any other medication to self-administer in school. For safety, all

medicines must be handed in at the school office, where they will be logged and the necessary forms completed. Staff are required to check prescription details, so please ensure that all medication is sent in its original packaging. For pupils with long-term medical needs, including allergies or underlying health conditions, we work closely with healthcare professionals to create individual care plans. Our staff receive appropriate training, and we are always here to help. If you have any questions or concerns about your child's medical needs, please speak to Mrs Major or Mrs Towell, who will be happy to support you.
